

Free and Reduced applications for all schools

Parents must fill out a new application every year. Paper applications will be available at the District Office at 264 S 400 E on July 1st and in all schools on August 1st. Students who qualified for free or reduced status last year will temporarily carry over their benefits for the first 30 school days of the new school year. If a new application is not filled out and approved by the end of this grace-period, the student will charge for meals at full price.

PLEASE NOTE: State law allows the district to take up to 10 days from receipt of the application to review and process it, so do not wait until the end of the grace period if you want to avoid charges.

In the event of separation or divorce, it is recommended for each parent to create their own application when applying. Please do not share information so that it is not accessible to anyone other than the parent filling out the application. Upon review of your application, you will be notified of approval/denial of benefits. If you have questions, please contact Mason Martin @ 435-259-2757.

If a student's family receives benefits from Special Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), the Family Employment Program (FEP) or the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR), the household automatically qualifies for meals at no charge. Once the school receives notice of the student's or family's eligibility, you do not have to complete or submit a free/reduced-price application. Schools will send the household an email/letter or phone call informing parents of the student's eligibility for free meals. If a parent qualifies for one of these programs and has not received such a letter before school starts, please contact Mason Martin @ 435-259-2757.

We recommend you complete your application online. Completing your application online is fast and easy. Online applications don't get lost or misplaced and there are no delays due to incomplete information.

Online Application

Parents can fill out an application online at <https://sis.seschools.org/Login>. Right below the login box is a smaller box which says: Contacts with Web Access may request a user name. Click there. You will need to know your student's I.D. number and date of birth. You can call the school secretary, teacher, or Child Nutrition Department to obtain the I.D. number. You will need to request a username for grade access and you will need to create a password. Remember your user name and password, as you will use it across all schools unless prompted to change it. There will be icons for **Food Service**, **Student Summary**, **Free/Reduced Meal Application** and **Update Student Contact Information**. Please update student contact information.

Here there is a list of frequently asked questions with answers and information to help applicants when filling out the information. If you don't have questions, click on the Begin Application button. Please read through the information and follow instructions. Answer each page as it pertains to your application. **Please, only one application for each household, with all your children's names, and the school they will attend. Even if you have a child living at home that will NOT be attending school, include them on your application!** If you receive food assistance, you will need your case number. When you are filling out income amounts you will need to fill in each family member's income and how often it is paid. If a family member does not have income, check the no income box. Make sure to check the electronic signature box. **Your application will not be successfully submitted if it is not complete.**
